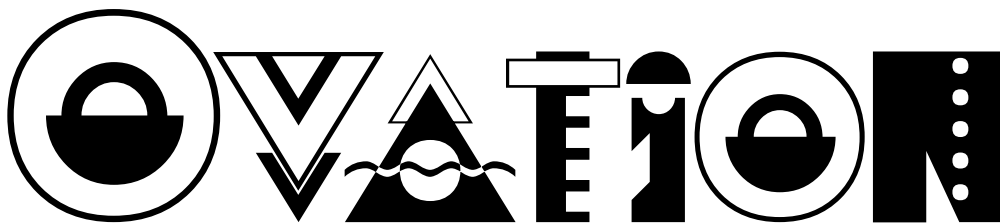

Spend a day in Nisbet Park and the opportunity to view and purchase exquisite artwork will be just two of the benefits available to guests who visit the Loveland Art Show on Sept. 24 from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. This will be the tenth anniversary of the outdoor art show.

More than 50 artists will be available, along with art in all price ranges. Choices will range from photography to ceramics, wood-working, jewelry, baskets, sculpture and original paintings in various media. It's a great opportunity to purchase that special gift or to just browse in a relaxed park setting.

The show promises activities for all ages and interests. Kids Korner offers a variety of hands-on special projects to entertain youngsters, exposing them to art and providing the opportunity to take home finished pieces. Kids Korner is provided free of charge by the Loveland area Girl Scouts.

School age artists can also participate by exhibiting their work in the area especially for students. Artists must register by Sept. 15. Full rules and applications are available at all4art.info.

The Loveland Art Show is a juried and judged art show, with prizes offered in each of the art categories. This year's judges are Greg Storer and Tom Tsuchiya. Storer is a painter and pastel artist, teacher, and owner of The Powder Factory Studio in Kings Mills. Tsuchiya is a sculptor and teacher from Kenwood, and is most famous for the bronze statue of Joe Nuxall at Great American Ballpark.

At the Loveland Art Show the "Starving Artist Cafe" will offer food and drink in Nisbet park from Seafood Station, Paxton's Grill, The Works Restaurant, Blue Chip Cookie, and The BuzzThru Espresso Bar. Classical music will be provided by WGUC radio.

LOVELAND ART SHOW

LAST CALL TO ARTISTS:

All work must be the original work of the exhibitor.

We will not accept plastics, sand-art, silk flowers, molded plaster, greenware or items made from a kit, pre-manufactured or commercially made items (t-shirts, sweat-shirts, towels, etc). Artists must

provide all equipment needed to display and protect their work (easels, display panels, tent or canopy, table, chairs, etc). Spaces are 10'x10'. A detailed information packet will be sent to you around Labor Day. This will include check-in details, map, parking pass, setting-up and tearing-down procedure. Complimentary coffee and donuts will be available during set-up. The deadline for discounted entry fee is May 15 and artists will be notified within 10 days. **Entries received after Aug.1 will be considered pending space available in your category.**

Only one artist per booth and each artist will be judged in one category only. Items to show must be able to fit into four categories.

Painting - all media

Drawing/ Photography/Prints/Collage

Ceramics/Sculpture/Wood

Fiber/Glass/Jewelry

Artists under 21 may display their work in the Youth Exhibit.
